## <u>Topics</u>

The children are doing lots of activities related to the topic of 'Me and My Family' and will be developing our Growth Mindset. We will also be doing lots of counting and recognising numbers. The children have been very interested in using the paint and we will be exploring and mixing colours. We are busy finding out about our new classrooms. We have been learning how to look after the resources and where everything lives. The children are encouraged to tidy up what they have been playing with. Lots of practice at home will help!

## <u>Class Dojo</u>

Thank you for signing up. We hope you are enjoying seeing what the children are doing during their day in school. We will also send messages/ reminders home on class dojo so please keep checking.

## Illness

If your child displays any symptoms of Covid, a new continuous cough, a temperature or loss of taste or smell, please keep them off and get them tested with a PCR test. Please keep us updated on your progress. If your child is poorly with sickness or diarrhoea please keep them at home for at least 48 hours after the last bout, until they are well. Thank you for your support.

## Reading Books

All children will get a reading book and reading record book on Friday 24<sup>th</sup> September. Please read with your child every day and write in the record book when you read together. **Please bring the books to school every day in the school book bag.** We will hear each child read their reading book once a week but if you feel that your child has got everything out of their book please send us a message on class dojo and we will give them a new book.

## <u>Bags</u>

The only bag your child will need in school every day is a school book bag. If you do wish to send in a change of clothes/ underwear in case of accidents please put it in a bag labelled with your child's name on their coat peg. (No plastic bags, please!) This can then be left in school, alternatively keep a change of clothes in their book bag. Thank you

## <u>Coats</u>

The children do need a coat in school **every day** as we do try to go outside whatever the weather! The children are encouraged to fasten their own coats. Please practice this at home. Please put your child's name in the coat.

#### <u>Wellingtons</u>

Please can all children have a pair of wellingtons with their name on to keep in school. We do go outside every day and it can get a bit muddy. The wellies can be kept on the welly racks. Thank you

As part of the Early Years Foundation Stage curriculum the children are encouraged to get messy and explore using all their senses in the Outdoor Mud Kitchen. Although aprons are provided they may occasionally come home messy.
