Topics

Our new topic is all about Under the water and at the seaside! We will be looking at sea creatures and naming, describing and sorting them into groups. We are going to read stories related to this topic including The Rainbow Fish and Pirates Love Underpants. We are going to draw and label sea creatures. We will also be doing some science experiments related to our Under the Water theme. We are continuing to work on using a capital letter at the start of a sentence and a full stop at the end and trying to remember to leave a space between each word as well as forming all letters correctly. In maths we are improving our ability to problem solve and to develop our skills in spatial reasoning. We will be telling the time to o'clock and learning the value of different coins. We will also be consolidating some of the different maths skills we have learnt this year in reception. During the Summer term as part of Healthy Lifestyles week we will also be looking at different families, routines of the day, heathy eating and the importance of good hygiene.

Transition into Year 1

In September the children will be moving into Year 1. The children will have an opportunity to go into their new classroom and become familiar with it before we finish for the Summer Holiday. The Year 1 staff will also be sending home a transition leaflet for the children to keep at home and share with you. On Friday 11th July in the morning, it will be class swap day. The children will line up that morning ready to go into Year 1 instead of Reception. (Details to follow)

Reading and library Books

Library Books

We visit the school library every week . RE on a Wednesday and RHB on a Friday and really enjoying choosing a new book to bring home. Please ensure your child has their library book in school every Wednesday or Friday to swap it for a new one. If a library book has got lost either donate a good quality book or send in a donation of £5 towards a new book. If you are unsure which was the last library book your child had please ask your child's class teacher, as we do keep a log of which books have been borrowed. Thank you.

Water Bottles

Please can you ensure that your children are bringing in water to school and not juice in their water bottles. Thank you

PE and Earrings

PE lessons are on a Tuesday for RE and Mondays for RHB. Please can you ensure that the children are NOT wearing ear rings for PE days. The children need to come into school in their PE kits on their PE day. They will need to wear navy or black jogging bottoms, a plain white T shirt and a navy tracksuit top or their school jumper. They can wear trainers or pumps.

Please ensure that ALL uniform including school jumpers, PE tops and trainers and shoes are clearly labelled with your child's name.

Illness

If your child has a high temperature, please keep your child off school until the temperature has settled and they feel well enough to return to school. If your child is poorly with sickness or diarrhoea please keep them at home for at least 48 hours after the last bout, until they are well.

Sun Cream
