Topics

The children are doing lots of activities related to the topic of 'All Are Welcome' and will be developing our Growth Mindset. As the weather and seasons change, we will be finding out all about Autumn. We will also be doing lots of counting and recognising numbers. The children have been very interested in using the paint and we will be exploring and mixing colours. We are busy finding out about our new classrooms. We have been learning how to look after the resources and where everything lives. The children are encouraged to tidy up what they have been playing with. Lots of practice at home will help!

Class Dojo

Thank you for signing up. Please ensure you have notifications turned on. We hope you are enjoying seeing what the children are doing during their day in school. We will also send messages/ reminders home on class dojo so please keep checking.

Illness

If your child has a high temperature please keep your child off school until the temperature has settled and they feel well enough to return to school.

If your child is poorly with sickness or diarrhoea please keep them at home for at **least 48 hours after the last bout, until they are well.**

Reading Books

All children will get a reading book and reading record book on Friday 2nd October. Please read with your child every day and write in the record book when you read

together. We will read with all the children three times each week when we are doing guided reading. **Please bring the books to school every day in the school book bag.**

Bags

The only bag your child will need in school every day is a **school book bag**. If you do wish to send in a change of clothes/ underwear in case of accidents please put it in a bag labelled with your child's name on their coat peg. (No plastic bags, please!) This can then be left in school, alternatively keep a change of clothes in their book bag.

Coats

The children do need a coat in school **every day** as we do try to go outside whatever the weather! The children are encouraged to fasten their own coats. Please practice this at home. Please put your child's name in the coat.

Wellingtons

Please can all children have a pair of wellingtons with their name on to keep in school. We do go outside every day and it can get a bit muddy. The wellies can be kept on the welly racks. Thank you

Boxes

Please can you send in any cardboard boxes you have finished with at home so we can use them in our Make and Do Area. No toilet rolls please! This will help to further enhance our 'make and do' area where the children enjoy being very creative and make brilliant 2D and 3D models. Thank you.
